LITERARY GENRES Format

Tells the story of a hero May be based on facts and real history, but through numerous retellings the hero and his or her deeds become larger than life, and some facts are distorted realistic fiction Setting: a real place or could be a real place Elements The events in the story could happen in real life

Retelling Using Different Methods

to do this, students must remember the story, pick out the important pieces, and tell the story once again in the correct order A retelling is different than a summary in that a summary reduces story length and only reports main ideas or topics, while a retelling recounts all story events, details, and even story language and phrases

he beginning of a story is called a "lead" The lead can be a sentence, a paragraph, or even a page long A good beginning "leads" a reader into the story It makes them want to find out more It catches their attention, enticing them to continue reading Skilled writers start their stories with good leads A good lead adds to your "voice"
